


## **Shubie Park Trail Guide**

## **The Shubenacadie Canal**

Shubie Park is part of the Shubenacadie Waterway, a 114 km system consisting of seven lakes and one river that connects Kjipuktuk (Halifax Harbour) to Pekwitapa'qek (The Bay of Fundy). Within Shubie Park's well-maintained multi-use trails visitors can explore a significant amount of the Canal's built heritage including Lock 2, Lock 3 and the Deep Cut.

The Shubenacadie Canal Commission operate the Fairbanks Interpretive Centre, located at the main entrance to Shubie Park. The Fairbanks Centre features a working scale model of a canal lock along with newly renovated displays. The new exhibits feature the cultural and natural history of the waterway and offer new opportunities for hands-on engagement and learning. There is no charge for admission, but donations are welcome.
